6. Continuing Business

a. NS Asset Management Cohort Program

At the July 17th Asset Management Committee meeting, an overview of the NS Asset Management Cohort Program, which is being run by the AIM Network, was provided for the Committee's information. Staff will provide further updates on the progress of the initiative.

b. Five Year Capital Improvements Plan

Staff has prepared a five year Capital Improvements Plan for consideration and approval by the Committee. Materials for discussion will be provided at the meeting.

c. Update on Local Improvements By-law Projects

Over the summer, letters were circulated to residents of properties in the areas of the proposed wastewater line extensions on Highway 7 and in South Side Harbour, and the proposed water line extension on Cameron Kinney Hill, to gauge interest in cost sharing under the Local Improvements Bylaw. The results of these requests for input were as follows:

Southside Harbour Road Sewer Extension: The deadline for property owners to endorse this sewer extension was Friday, August 31. The results are: Yes = 7, No = 10, No Response (which are considered a No) = 8. This project has not met the threshold set for property owner endorsement to proceed. With the Committee's consent, a letter will be sent advising the property owners of this outcome.

Cameron Kinney Hill Water Extension: The deadline for property owners to endorse this sewer extension was Friday, September 7. The results will be reviewed at the meeting.

West River Sewer Extension: The deadline for property owners to endorse this sewer extension was

Friday, September 7. The results will be reviewed at the meeting.

d. J-Class Roads for Cost-Share Program Consideration

Each year the Municipality has the opportunity to apply for 50% cost sharing from the Province for treatment (paving, repaving or chip seal) of J-Class Roads. This application is due by October 31. Some roads that receive upgrades are subject to local improvement charges. The petition for local improvement charges must be complete prior to application to TIR.

Further to a memo circulated by email earlier in August, Council has been asked to identify any J-Class roads that they would like considered for work under this program. To date, two roads have been flagged for consideration: Somers Road for chip-seal, and Havre Boucher Wharf Road for resurfacing. A list of J-Class Roads in the County is attached for reference.

e. Discussion about Trunk 4 and Beech Hill Road Intersection

An opportunity for staff to provide any updates received from the Department of Transportation and Infrastructure Renewal regarding the study and improvement of this intersection.

7. New Business

a. KAW Developments Ltd. Request

A request has been received from KAW Development Ltd. regarding sanitary sewer lines for their property on South River Road. A copy of the letter, as well as a survey plan, is attached for reference.

4. Business Arising from the Minutes

There was no business arising from the minutes.

5. New Business

a. Update on Federal / Provincial Infrastructure Funding Opportunities

Mr. Horne provided an update regarding funding requests that have been made to various levels of government for capital infrastructure projects, where the response has been that a decision has yet to be made. Warden McCarron provided further details regarding discussions that took place earlier in the day with the Premier at an event. For PCAP, unofficial notification has been received noting that the application made for Appleseed Drive was not successful. Finally, the Municipality was successful in receiving \$10,400 for beautification projects at the pavilion, the landing, and for signage on Highway 337.

b. Beech Hill Waterline Extension

Mr. Horne reviewed the summary given in the memo, providing background on the proposed expansion to the project scope for the waterline extension to include the three properties adjacent to the Municipal Office. The property owners have been consulted and are in favour of contributing to the project.

The Committee recommends that Municipal Council approve expanding the project scope for the Beech Hill Waterline Extension.

c. <u>Local Improvement Options for West River Sewer</u>

Mr. Horne reviewed the options that are available for the inclusion of nine (9) e-One pumps that are required as part of the proposed sewer line extension in West River.

A question was asked regarding responsibility for repair and maintenance of the pumps once they are installed. Mr. Horne noted that the options as outlined specify that the responsibility for repair and maintenance after installation would be the responsibility of the property owner. Discussion followed.

Consensus was provided to proceed with Option 3. The next step will be the distribution of information letters with residents, following further consultation with the District Councillor.

d. <u>Asset Management Cohort Program</u>

Mr. Horne noted that the Municipality has been accepted into a pilot program with the Province for the Asset Management data collection and condition assessments, as has the Town. The Municipality has also been approached by the Atlantic Infrastructure Management Network (AIM Network), with an invitation regarding further Asset Management information dissemination.

In response to your email regarding the J class road up grades. Our community has being struggling with the use of the Cape Jack Beach access. The Cape Jack Wharf Rd. is a short branch off the Cape Jack Rd. that allows access. The road is falling apart along the shoulders with several pot holes. The community is working towards forming a committee that is working to try and establish provincial park status for the beach. We are requesting from the government assistance in creating proper access, parking and picnic tables. The beach is extensively used by the community but also summer tourists throughout the summer months. Through the summer there is always summer travelers that camp over night at the beach

Cape Jack Beach is number 4 on the list of Antigonish County Beaches in the "County Connect" brochure, so it would be great if at least the road accessing it, along with the several homes on it, have a proper finished road!

The beach is used by locals & tourists all summer and the road has lots of traffic on it, so I'm asking if it can be one considered for the upgrade.

RE: South River Road Lot Design

Thank you for taking time to listen to my concerns regarding the sanitary sewer lines for our property on the South River Road.

As discussed, our initial plan was to utilize the services of Maritime Directional Drilling to minimize the impact on existing infrastructure and lands. However, upon further review of the sewer lines we have realized the direct sewer services to individual lots is not possible.

- * Lot 1, 2 and 3 are unable to be serviced because there is only a force main in front of each lot.
- * Lot 4 and 5 have gravity sewer on the other side of the road but are not deep enough to enable gravity sewer services to be drilled due to the insulation requirements.

After discussions with Antigonish County public works staff and STRUM Engineers, it seems our only option is to bring a larger 8 inch pipe line across the road at Lot 6. This will then result in the requirement for a new sewer main that will service all six building lots.

There is interest from several parties in purchasing these building lots and we would appreciate you taking the time to review this plan for servicing the lots to determine if council would be willing to assist with the financial burden.

The attached price is an estimated cost for the service crossing the road as well as the supply and install of a new manhole to collect several sewer lines. The drilling prices are based on a quote obtained from Mike McCarron at Maritime Directional Drilling.

If you have any questions, we can meet to discuss this more at your earliest convenience.
