1. <u>Call to Order – Chairman, Councillor Bill MacFarlane</u>

The meeting of the Asset Management Committee was called to order by the Chair, Councillor MacFarlane, at 5:30pm

2. Approval of Agenda

Councillor MacFarlane called for any additions or deletions to the agenda.

3. Approval of July 4, 2019 Asset Management Minutes

4. Business Arising from the Minutes

Staff had provided the requested information regarding the private road by-law and administrative order in HRM. A discussion about that information will be included in the September agenda.

5. <u>Continuing Business</u>

a. <u>Update on 2019/20 Capital Projects</u>

Mr. Horne reviewed the 2019/2020 capital priorities list, which included details on the estimate, funding, the tender status and bid price for each item which was discussed in detail.

b. Petition for Road Upgrades at Gorman & Afton Roads

Councillor Dunbar spoke to an issue in District 7 and 8 regarding the condition of Gorman road and Afton Road. Where the new interchange has been constructed, it connects to the Afton Road, which is a narrow unpaved road with no ditching. There has been an increase in traffic with residents taking this route to access the 104 instead of going back towards Monastery or crossing under the 104 to Route 4. A petition was presented from the area residents for this roadway to be paved, and a motion was requested to send that petition to the Minister of Transportation and Infrastructure Renewal. Councillor Mattie spoke further to area resident concerns regarding the condition of the old road, and its ability to handle the additional traffic and the construction traffic hauling gravel from Merland to Bayside. Winter maintenance was also noted as a concern.

The Committee recommends that Municipal Council forward the petition received for road upgrades at Gorman and Afton Roads to the Hon. Lloyd Hines, Minister of Transportation and the Hon. Randy Delorey, Minister of Health and Antigonish MLA.

c. <u>Update on Proposed Gaspereaux Lake Water System Local Improvement</u>

Mr. Horne provided an update on the Local Improvements By-law process underway for the proposed expansion to the Gaspereaux Lake Water System. There is now sufficient support to move forward with the project. Consensus of the Committee was that the project was approved, but is subject to funding support from the Federal and Provincial governments to proceed.

6. New Business

a. Ownership of Water & Sewer Infrastructure on South River Road

Mr. Horne referred to the letter in the agenda package from the Director of Public Works to himself regarding the infrastructure constructed by KAW Developments on South River Road, verifying that the lines have been constructed, have been inspected and tested, and recommending that the Municipality takes ownership.

The Committee recommends that Municipal Council approves the Municipality taking ownership of the water and sewer line constructed by KAW Developments servicing six (6) lots at South River Road.

b. Ownership of Clydesdale Waterline

Mr. Horne referred to letter from the Town of Antigonish in the agenda package. The section of the waterline to be acquired will be used to extend the waterline to North Grant. The advantage of this water line to the Municipality is the existing river crossing of the service, which was upgraded by the Town only a few years ago.

The Committee recommends that Municipal Council approve applying to the Nova Scotia Utility and Review Board (NSURB) to take ownership of a waterline in Clydesdale.

c. <u>Notice of J-Class Road Cost Share Application</u>

Mr. Horne provided information regarding the cost-share program and a list of J-Class roads in the Municipality. A future agenda will include a request for a list of roads to formally submit for consideration for the program.

d. Request to be Added to the Infrastructure List - Dunmore Road

Warden McCarron spoke to a letter from Dunmore Developments requesting that consideration be given to adding 1.9kms of sewer on the Dunmore Road to the infrastructure list. Consensus was given to add the requested project to the infrastructure list.

7. Additions to the Agenda

a. Highway Sign Update

Councillor Corbett requested an update on the speed-indicating signage. He requested that one of the Municipality's existing signs be moved to Aulds Cove for the summer.
