# **CONTINUING BUSINESS**

#### a. Smart Cities Challenge Discussion

Staff will be providing an update on the work done to date in developing a challenge statement as part of the Smart Cities Challenge.

#### b. Active Transportation Priorities Approval

#### c. Awarding of a Tender for Tree Harvesting

A tender was issued to harvest low-grade trees from an approximately 10HA area of the Beech Hill Solid Waste Resource Management Facility, closing Friday, April 13. Typically, the Municipality would clear land at its own cost. In this instance the Director of Public Works thought it advisable to issue a tender for the land clearing to see if we could get any value. #### **CALL TO ORDER**

The meeting of the Committee of the Whole was called to order by the Chair, Warden McCarron, at 7:02pm.

# **APPROVAL OF AGENDA**

The following items were added to the agenda:

- Loan Guarantee for the Aulds Cove Fire Department
- Bank Erosion on the West River

Moved by Deputy Warden Stewart and seconded by Councillor MacFarlane that the agenda be approved as amended. Motion carried.

#### **APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

Warden McCarron called three times for any errors or omissions in the March 20<sup>th</sup>, Committee of the Whole minutes.

Moved by Councillor Dunbar and seconded by Councillor Corbett that the Committee of the Whole minutes of March 20<sup>th</sup> be approved. Motion carried.



#### **DELEGATIONS**

#### Strait Area Ground Search and Rescue

Representatives from the Strait Area Ground Search and Rescue provided members of the Committee with a brief overview of the history of their operations, and their recent renovations to their facility in Monastery, including the installation of heat pumps, and increases in their membership over the past year. Their plans for additional renovations to the building, as well as their anticipated future equipment needs were also reviewed. Funding currently available to the organization was discussed, and the GS&R representatives noted that they intended to seek funding via a levy via each participating municipality, as opposed to annually applying for grants, and would be making this request to the Mayors & Wardens Committee. Discussion followed. The presenters were thanked, and Warden McCarron noted that their current grant funding request would be considered as part of the budget deliberations.

#### **CONTINUING BUSINESS**

#### AT Priority Setting Update and Recommendations

Ms. Melanson reviewed the staff report that was provided to the Committee. The chart, outlining how the AT Advisory Committee ranked priorities and projects for action this year was discussed. Questions were asked regarding coordination with TIR and timing for requests for widening of roads to include bike lanes, particularly out to the Keppoch where there is a lot of on-road bike traffic now. A question was also raised regarding the definition of Active Transportation; the Advisory Committee will be reviewing this in the future.

#### Consideration of a Response to MODG Regarding the NS Onshore Petroleum Atlas

The Committee was asked how they would like to approach the request from the Municipality of the District of Guysborough regarding the NS Onshore Petroleum Atlas. Discussion followed regarding options. The Committee decided not to issue a response at this time.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

#### Financial Update

Mrs. Duggan provided the Committee with a brief summary of the PVSC Capped Assessment Comparison (F16/17 vs. F17/18), and assessment information for the 2018/2019 Budget. Discussion about trends, implications, and the notice about increased education costs followed.

#### Communities in Bloom

Mrs. Schumacher noted that information had been received from Communities in Bloom regarding their annual challenge. Councillors were requested to contact staff if they were interested in further information for their communities.

#### Discussion Regarding Volunteer Fire Departments

Councillor Corbett enquired whether Council has ever looked at or asked for the guiding policy documents for Volunteer Fire Departments. Mr. Horne noted the Municipality's financial relationship with these organizations via the role that the Municipality plays in collecting levys on their behalf; as part of this, the Municipality requests their financial statements.



#### UNSM Request to Include Discussion of UNSM Priorities on Council Agendas

Correspondence attached to the agenda package was reviewed. The Committee identified that cellular and broadband coverage was not included in the list of priorities. Committee members were asked to forward any additional comments that they have to staff.

# FCM Conference 2018

The Committee discussed who would be interested in attending the FCM 2018 Conference, which is taking place in Halifax. Warden McCarron and Deputy Warden Stewart indicated that they would like to go. Staff will follow-up with Councillors MacDonald and Chisholm, who were absent for the discussion.

#### Loan Guarantee for the Aulds Cove Volunteer Fire Department

The Municipality has been asked to provide a guarantee for a loan sought by the Aulds Cove Volunteer Fire Department, as they look to replace/upgrade some of their fleet.

Moved the Councillor Corbett and seconded by Councillor MacLellan that the Committee recommends that Municipal Council provide a \$40,000 loan guarantee for the Aulds Cove Volunteer Fire Department. Motion carried.

#### Bank Erosion on the West River

Councillor MacFarlane brought forward an ongoing concern regarding the extent of the bank erosion along the West River near the bridge on the Sunrise Trail/St. Andrew's Street in Greenwold. Discussion



followed. A request was made to send a letter to the local MLA, Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing, and the Department of Transportation.

Moved by Councillor MacFarlane and seconded by Deputy Warden Stewart that the Committee recommends that Municipal Council send a letter to Hon. Randy Delorey, MLA Antigonish, as well as the Minister of Municipal Affairs and Department of Transportation, noting concern with the ongoing erosion of the bank of the West River at the Bridge on the Sunrise Trail in Greenwold. Motion carried.

#### **UPDATE**

Youth, Faith; Justice; Business; Academia; Health; Seniors; Community; Culture; and the tool of social media were all engaged with the following three questions. These questions are broad and about dreaming big for our community.

- 1. Imagine you had \$5 million to spend over the next 3 years on improving life for all in our community, what would you do? How would you use technology to make and maintain those improvements?
- 2. If suddenly that doubled to \$10 million, what would you add?
- 3. Fast forward --Ten years have passed; it is 2029 in Antigonish County, (you have spent the \$5-\$10 million) what 3 words describe our community?

A press release went to all local media and shared provincially as well.

Ideas are abundant and there is excitement about the challenge.

The diversity of response has emphasized the need to filter them to ensure the challenge statement stays true to municipal mandate.

Broad areas identified so far in feedback include Water; Energy; Sport/ Athletics Development; Food Security; Tourism and Arts.

# **Proclamation**

# Start By Believing

Statistics Canada reports that in 2015, Nova Scotians reported 635 incidents of sexual assault to police. As one of the most underreported crimes in Canada, only 1 in 10 victims will report incidents of sexual violence. This would mean there were over 6,000 incidents of sexual assault in Nova Scotia in 2015.

Whereas, Sexual Assault Awareness Month is intended to draw attention to the fact that sexual violence is widespread and has public health, legal, and social implications for every person living in Nova Scotia;

Whereas, Rape, sexual assault, child sexual abuse, and sexual harassment continue impact our communities;

Whereas, St. Francis Xavier University and Paqtnkek Mi'Kmaw Nation are both part of the broader Antigonish community, we support and salute both of their continued efforts to prevent sexualized violence, and support those impacted by sexual violence.

Whereas, the Canadian Truth and Reconciliation Commission's "Calls to Action" challenge us to both recognize the increased levels of sexual violence experienced by both Aboriginal men and women, as well as to work with Indigenous communities to provide culturally relevant services to address sexual violence;

Whereas, the Antigonish Women's Resource Centre & Sexual Assault Services Association and other anti-violence advocates and support service programs encourage every person to reject victim-blaming mentalities and "Start By Believing" in order to make a difference in the lives of survivors of sexual violence;

Whereas, With leadership, dedication, and encouragement, there is compelling evidence that we can be successful in reducing sexual violence in Antigonish Town and County through increased prevention and awareness education, community mobilization, and holding perpetrators who commit acts of violence responsible for their actions;

Whereas, the Town and County Governments of Antigonish strongly support the efforts of national, Provincial, and local conversations about sexual violence; what it is, how to prevent it, how to help survivors connect with services, and how every segment of our society can work together to better address it.

Now therefore be it resolved,

That we, the undersigned, join advocates and communities across the country in taking action to prevent sexual violence. On behalf of our federal and provincial government representatives, members of Antigonish Town Council and the Municipal Council of the County of Antigonish, and St. Francis Xavier University we do hereby proclaim April as SEXUAL ASSAULT AWARENESS MONTH in Antigonish Town and County and we comment this observance to all citizens.
