## 6. <u>Continuing Business</u>

#### a. Antigonish Bikeway Study

Ms. Melanson provided the Committee with an overview of the responses to the Request for Proposals for a consultant to do the design and concept plan for the feasibility study for the Bikeway Study.

# c. <u>Discussion about Request to Consider Private Roads Maintenance Levy</u> <u>By-law</u>

Mrs. Schumacher presented a staff report summarizing the information gathered regarding a constituent request to look the possibility of a by-law for private road maintenance levies. Overall, staff questioned the ability for a by-law to be truly effective if homeowners cannot be compelled to joint the association that is looking to have the Municipality collect fees on its behalf. Discussion followed. Staff was requested to draft a letter to the constituent outlining the findings and Committee's decision to not proceed further with developing the by-law.

## a. Antigonish Event Strategy

Mrs. Donovan provided an introduction to a collaborative effort between the Town, County, and St. FX looking at creating a formal approach to attracting events as a means to promote year-round tourism. The proposal is conceptual at this time, but any questions or comments were welcomed. Discussion followed.

## b. <u>Dry Hydrants</u>

Councillor Deveau has received a request for the installation of dry hydrants in his district. Several fire departments in the Municipality have asked for this in the past. Staff was requested to look into the issue further to evaluate need and interest for the Committee's consideration.



#### c. Linwood Station Safety Hazard

Councillor Mattie received a call from a constituent who received notice that the school will no longer permit a bus to run down Linwood Station Road due to safety concerns with the large hole that the railway dug on either side of the tracks, and a student must now travel 1.5 kms to the main road. The holes are now full of approximately 8 feet of water and a foot of mud with gravel hills around the hole; small children live in and visit the immediate area. Staff were asked to extend an invitation to the local MLAs to attend that meeting and were asked to look at what ability under the Dangerous and Unsightly By-law.
