RE: Aqua Arthritis – Aging well in Antigonish Town and County.

We are writing to request assistance for vouchers for travel to and from the St. F. X pool for members of our class that are unable to attend without transportation. We are asking for \$500.00 from the town and \$500.00 from the county to be put towards vouchers for our members. We are hoping that Antigonish transit could bill you directly.

The Arthritis Aquatic Program is for adults with chronic injuries, recovering from surgery or other medical conditions, or those needing support to get active in the water. This program offered at St. F X welcomes all. Thank you ST. F X for all you do for us – reduced fees, pool access and wonderful life guards that waive and cheer us on!

We learn from each other. Our instructors started out as participants and are now in the process of training to be leaders. Seniors teaching seniors. The present group represents appox. 50 people ranging in age from 50-85 with a usual group of 30 people in the pool three times a week. (this is reduced in winter to about 20 because of driving and slush)

The focus is on heart, body and mind. Often our participants are single (spouse has passed away and children are away), lonely and shy. We recognize the need to allow time for connecting, learning and being active. These elements have increased our appreciation and support for each other. One of our participants, Val, was very nervous getting into the pool with her prostatic leg and now she is one of our greatest cheerleaders! We are also focused on reaching out to others to join our program, as we know the first hand how much it helps our physical and mental wellness.

One of the major challenges we have is participants do not like to bother anyone about a ride to and from the gym. We are trying to make this program accessible for ourselves and others as we know that the pool reduces pain as well as social isolation.

Thank you for your consideration. If this works out this year, we hope to apply for provincial funding next year.
