Reference: Amendments to the West River Antigonish Harbour Land Use By-law to permit

medical clinics in the C-2 zone and government buildings and facilities in all zones.

#### Recommendation

That Council amend the West River Antigonish Harbour Land Use By-law to:

1. Permit medical clinics in the General Commercial (C-2) zone; and

2. Permit government buildings and facilities in all zones.

#### **Background Information**

A new collaborative medical practice and ambulance depot are expected to be located within the West River Antigonish Harbour Plan Area in the future. Properties within the General Commercial (C-2) zone have been identified as possible candidate sites. Neither use is currently permitted within the C-2 zone.

#### **Medical Clinics**

Medical clinics are listed as a permitted use in several zones, but not within the C-2 zone. Policy L-3.4 of the Planning Strategy establishes the permitted uses, stating that:

It shall be the policy of Council to establish within the Land Use By-law a General Commercial (C-2) Zone within the Commercial Designation and to permit within this zone a number of commercial uses, as outlined in the Land Use By-law.

The C-2 zone currently permits medical laboratories, pharmacies, and veterinary services. Medical clinics are similar in nature in terms of the services they provide, the space they require, and the typical volume of visitors. Consequently, it is reasonable and in keeping with the Planning Strategy to permit medical clinics within this zone.

#### **Ambulance Depots**

The Planning Strategy and Land Use By-law do not speak specifically to ambulance depots. However, the plan does acknowledge that "Government and agency buildings can benefit the public by providing social, emergency and other types of services and should be allowed anywhere." Therefore, Policy CS-1.6 states that "It is the intention of Council to permit

government buildings and facilities in all zones subject to the requirements of that particular zone." This policy is not currently implemented within the Land Use By-law; this should be corrected. Appendix A includes amendments which would carry out Policy CS-1.6 and define government buildings and facilities. In keeping with the intent of the policy, the definition includes emergency services which would include an ambulance depot.

#### Conclusion

Medical clinics are similar in nature to other uses currently permitted in the C-2 zone. Therefore, staff recommend that medical clinics be listed as a permitted use in the zone.

The Land Use By-law should be updated to reflect Policy CS-1.6 of the Planning Strategy, which states that government buildings and facilities are to be permitted in all zones. A definition for the use should also be added.

The recommended amendments are provided in Appendix A.

#### Appendix A

#### A BYLAW TO AMEND THE WEST RIVER ANTIGONISH HARBOUR LAND USE BY-LAW

PART 6: GENERAL PROVISIONS FOR ALL ZONES is hereby amended by inserting the following text in bold immediately following s. 6.A.13 Front Yard for a Through Lot and renumbering the remaining sections accordingly:

#### **Government Buildings and Facilities**

6.A.14 Government buildings and facilities shall be permitted within any zone subject to compliance with the applicable provisions of that particular zone.

Section 16.1 of PART 16: GENERAL COMMERCIAL (C-2) ZONE is hereby amended by inserting the following text in bold and re-lettering the remaining sections accordingly:

#### I. Medical clinics

PART 25: DEFINITIONS is hereby amended by inserting the following text in bold in alphabetical order:

GOVERNMENT BUILDINGS AND FACILITIES means a building or facility where one of the three levels of government provides services to the public. Examples include but are not limited to, courthouses, post offices, hospitals, employment offices, libraries, and emergency services.

Dear Warden McCarron:

As is the case in other provinces, Nova Scotia is facing a challenge regarding the availability and affordability of housing. While this challenge is felt by so many Nova Scotians, it is also acutely felt by employers, including healthcare and construction employers, who are trying to recruit much needed workers in their sectors. This challenge has recently been further intensified in some communities where residents have been displaced by wildfires.

The Province is committed to growing our investments in housing. We have announced several affordable housing projects across the province in recent months. And, as you know, we have recently leveraged a partnership with the Housing Trust of Nova Scotia to invest \$20M in modular housing. One of the barriers they have experienced in advancing their modular builds is the availability of serviced and/or serviceable land.

While we will continue to grow our inventory of provincially owned land for housing, we are also asking for your help by sharing a list of any municipally owned, serviced (or easily serviceable) land that may be suitable for any type of new housing development, or unused buildings on serviced land for which you currently do not have any planned future use. This will help us to identify future opportunities for housing investments.

We value the partnership we have with municipalities across the province and know you are dealing with the reality of this housing challenge every day in your community. Many of you have received several requests from us as we try to find solutions to housing. We appreciate your responsiveness and willingness to put forward ideas.

Together, we can move the marker on housing. We look forward to hearing back from you and request information be submitted to Jennifer MacIntyre at <a href="mailto:Jennifer.MacIntyre@novascotia.ca">Jennifer.MacIntyre@novascotia.ca</a> by July 15, 2023.

Dear Warden McCarron:

I am writing to let you know we will be reaching out to your Chief Administrative Officers to request their input on how to improve the application process for Nova Scotians seeking priority access to public housing under the inadequate housing stream.

In its June 2022 report, the Office of the Auditor General (OAG) of Nova Scotia found that current processes are insufficient to grant priority access to public housing. Priority access allows certain applicants to be placed at the top of the waitlist for public housing if they are:

- Victims of family violence
- In need of affordable housing in proximity to sustaining medical supports
- Living in inadequate housing which poses an immediate health or safety risk

To be approved for priority access under all three streams, applicants must submit forms documenting their situational requirements that are verified by a third party. Although the form for those living in inadequate housing indicates that it must be completed by fire, building and/or health inspectors, the OAG found that in some districts, applicants were unable to find the officials to do this for them. It concluded that further guidance is required on who can complete the forms, under what circumstances and whether the requirements are reasonable to meet so that only those most vulnerable are granted priority access.

We look forward to this discussion with your team so we can better understand how we can work together to ensure only the most vulnerable Nova Scotians in our communities are granted priority access to public housing.
