## Call to Order - Chairman, Warden Owen McCarron

## Business Arising from the Minutes

Councillor Mattie spoke to the boundary review issue that was discussed at the last meeting. He was curious to know whether Stantec would be joining the Committee in person or joining by Zoom. Mr. Horne noted that the suggestions made by Council in previous discussions are being incorporated into a revised map, which is in the process of being prepared to be provided to Council for their review. Councillor McNamara reviewed correspondence sent previously to the UARB regarding timelines, and asked whether Stantec could come to speak to Council in advance of the holidays. Mr. Horne provided an explanation of the different events that have resulted in the revisions to the project timeline.

## Delegations

There were no delegations.

## Continuing Business

## Consideration of Proposed Recreation Facility Feasibility Study

Mr. Horne spoke to the presentation provided by staff at the Joint Council meeting at the end of November and welcomed further discussion about the topic. A question was asked about whether any work had been done about finding a location for a
potential facility, and staff provided clarification that location would be one of the variables being analysed in the study. A question was also asked about whether the University would be involved, or if it would just be the Town and County; staff noted that only the Town and County would be involved. Questions about potential facility sizing were also asked, and Ms. Melanson explained how community engagement as part of the feasibility review would determine what size of facility would be required for what activities.
Statements were shared about concerns with the expense and the unanswered questions, the potential for costs in line with what the Pictou Wellness Centre incurs, and whether the facility would be for a unique use, like the mini-pitch project. Concern with the cost of the proposed feasibility study were there is so little definition of what uses would be considered. Concern of drawing business or events from community centres throughout the county were shared as well.

Other comments noted that the feasibility study would provide more clarification to the questions being asked, and a suggestion was made to have the County do its own inventory of infrastructure instead of committing to a study at the expense noted when there are two other major recreation developments underway. Some preliminary information space needs for certain recreational amenities, and general pricing for this kind of development, was also requested. A question was also asked about potential staffing for any future building, and a statement was made about the importance of having a pool in the community for swimming lessons.
Warden McCarron summarized to say that he was hearing that the Committee felt that some additional work needed to be done regarding a recreational facility in advance of putting out a Request for Proposals to narrow the scope of the analysis being requested. He reiterated the suggestion to do internal analysis and future discussions to review what is already in the community.

## Consideration of a Community Transit Service Review

Mr. Horne spoke to the memo in the agenda package and the recommended scope of the Request for Proposals being suggested for the review. Discussion about the proposed review and the benefit of the service to the community followed.

## Moved and Seconded

The Committee recommends to Municipal Council that a RFP be issued for a Community Transit Service Review in collaboration with the Town of Antigonish and Antigonish Community Transit.

## New Business

## Annual County / Town / Legion New Year Levee

Mrs. Schumacher provided the Committee with an update regarding the annual New Years Levee that is jointly hosted by the County, Town, and Legion. The event will be held from noon until 2 pm at the Legion, and the Town and County's contribution of $\$ 2,000$ each is the same as it was in 2022. Advertisements for the event are lined up to be posted online and in the local paper. Consensus was provided to make that contribution.

Appointment of Sgt. Warren McBeath as Traffic Authority
Mrs. Schumacher requested that the Committee appoint Sgt. Warren McBeath as the Municipality's Traffic Authority, as part of a records update with staff at the provincial Department of Public Works.

- Councillor Brophy noted that he would be attending the New Years Levee.
- Councillor Deveau shared that on December 3 ${ }^{\text {rd }}$ there was a Senior's Dinner in District 5 that was delivered to members in the community by volunteers. December 3 ${ }^{\text {rd }}$ was also the Santa Tour through District 5 and was well received.
- Councillor MacLellan shared that the Santa Tour on was in her district on December $2^{\text {nd }}$. There was good attendance despite the weather, and good reception to have Santa stop at the school in Maryvale. Good attendance at Christmas dance.
- Councillor Mattie shared that the Rock-A-Thon was held in Tracadie on Dec $2^{\text {nd }}$. Santa and Mrs. Claus were in Tracadie on December 10 th. New Years Event in Tracadie planned and already sold out.

## Reference: Antigonish County Boundary Review - District Boundary Adjustments

## 1 Background

Antigonish County notified Stantec of our selection to conduct an electoral boundary review via email on August 9, 2023. Stantec formally began work on the project with a Start-up Meeting on August 12, 2023. At that time, we assembled and began to assess information, including past electoral boundary decisions concerning Antigonish County and related map files, as well as information comparing the size of Nova Scotia municipal councils that we have assembled through other projects. At the Start-up Meeting we decided to hold a group meeting with Council members before proceeding with individual interviews with Councillors. The group meeting with Council took place on September 12. We separately interviewed all ten Council members and the Municipality's CAO between September 20 and October 5. In the meantime, we conducted our first phase consultation process, which consisted of a public meeting on September 25, 2023, and an online public survey that was open from September 18 to October 13.

The foregoing work activities constituted the first of two phases of the study process as set out in our proposal dated July 14, 2023. The two-phase approach follows the guidelines of the Nova Scotia Utility and Review Board (NUARB), to which the Municipality will submit its application to set its Council size and electoral district boundaries for the next eight years.

## 2 Findings and Recommendations

We summarized the results of our investigations in a Council Size Report completed on October 20, 2023. Stantec representatives met with Antigonish Council to present the report and respond to questions and concerns from Council members on November 28, 2023.

As explained in the report, responses to the online Council Size Survey strongly favoured continuing with ten Council members. The survey obtained 200 total responses, although not all respondents completed every question. Of 190 respondents who answered our question concerning council size preference, 113 or $59.5 \%$ stated they favoured the current ten. The proportion is the highest favouring a single council size that we have ever received among as many as 15 similar surveys that we have conducted. The second and third most preferred options were eight and twelve members, but they trailed considerably at $6.8 \%$ each.

Given that these preferences were not contradicted by input through our public consultation session or our consultation with Council through collective and individual interviews, Stantec created district boundary scenarios for eight, ten, and nine members. In view of the strong preference for ten members, we developed three scenarios for a ten-member Council:

- One generated by computer to satisfy the NSUARB's "voter parity" criterion that the number of electors (i.e., eligible voters) in all districts should be within $\pm 10 \%$ of the average number of electors in all districts.
- A second with adjustments to contain as much of the municipality's Acadian population in a single district as reasonable.
- A third that sought to satisfy the voter parity criterion with as little change as possible from the current district arrangement (i.e., by moving as few communities as possible between districts).

Proposed districts in all five proposed scenarios (i.e., one each for eight and nine Council members, and three for ten members) satisfied the parity criterion and none required the division of any community within the county defined for the Nova Scotia Civic Address File (NSCAF).

## 3 Council Decision

Following Stantec's November 28 presentation, Council discussed the boundary options presented. Several Councillors argued strongly that further assessment of scenarios should focus on choices involving ten members. In response to questioning, Stantec agreed that such an approach would be justified considering the strong support for ten members relative to other options. Councillors then discussed a variety of issues related to specific boundaries and the adjustments made to create each option. At the close of discussion, it was moved that Council consider the first electoral district scenario presented for ten council members, which was generated by the GIS utility called Build Balanced Zones without input from Stantec beyond incorporation of the voter parity criterion, and the third, which reflected the minimum number of changes to bring the current district arrangement within the parity standard.

The motion was put as follows and passed:
The Committee recommends that Municipal Council approves taking Scenario 1, 10 Districts with Minimum Variance and Scenario 3, 10 Districts with Minimum Change, forward to the second phase of public consultation for the Boundary Review, subject to further refinement to incorporate the suggestions of the Committee.

## 4 District Boundary Adjustments

Councillors' comments on boundary adjustments focused on Heatherton and Pomquet. Several Councillors argued that specific surrounding communities were connected to each of the two larger centres. In the case of Heatherton, Meadow Green, Black Avon, Frasers Grant, Summerside, Bayfield, and Paqtnkek were identified as related communities. Councillors did not specifically list communities considered to be
connected with Pomquet but did note, as Stantec was aware, that Pomquet is the primary Acadian community within the county. The communities that appear to be most closely related to Pomquet are Monk's Head, Upper Pomquet, Dagger Woods, and Taylor Road. Both Scenario 1 and Scenario 3 put Heatherton and Pomquet together in proposed District 7 with several of the communities considered to be linked to Heatherton in District 10 to the south.

Antigonish County staff worked with Stantec to address these issues through rearrangement of Scenario 3 to put Pomquet and Heatherton into separate districts. In the revised arrangement suggested by County staff, Pomquet is in proposed District 5, which roughly corresponds to proposed District 7 in the previous version of Scenario 3 and Heatherton is now in proposed District 7 , which covers most of the area of previous District 10.

While the change resolves the concerns with representing the communities of interest associated with Pomquet and Heatherton, moving the two relatively large communities interfered with voter parity. Further adjustments to other districts, several of which involved dividing NSCAF communities re-established balance among the proposed districts. Most notably, the addition of Heatherton and the related community of Pomquet Forks, which have 257 electors between them, to proposed District 7 required the removal of most of the community of St. Andrews ( 316 electors) to proposed District 6 . The addition of St. Andrews to District 6 was then balanced by shifting roughly half of the Lower South River community (410) to proposed District 5, which is centred on Pomquet, and Greenwold (319) to proposed District 10, which borders the eastern limits of the Town of Antigonish.

The addition of Greenwold to District 10, furthermore, allowed us to move Lanark (150) and Harbour Centre (90) to proposed District 2. We then shifted Lakevale (131) and Big Marsh (35) from proposed District 2 to proposed District 1 and moved Clydesdale (200) from proposed District 1 to proposed District 4. Brierly Brook (223) was also added to proposed District 4 from proposed District 2. The additions to proposed District 4 were balanced by the removal of much of West River and all of Salt Springs (131). Although 431 of 712 electors in West River were retained in proposed District 4, 106 were shifted to proposed District 6 and 201 to proposed District 3.

To the east of Pomquet and Heatherton, a small portion of Heatherton north to the Trans-Canada Highway (44 electors) was moved to proposed District 8 along with the Paqtnkek Reserve (246) and the community of Summerside (78). This allowed us to move the communities of Mattie Settlement (45) and Grosvenor (17) from proposed District 8 to proposed District 9 , where they are combined with communities to which County staff suggested they are better connected.

The initial separation of Pomquet and Heatherton clearly led to a domino effect on other proposed districts, which we normally find when larger adjustments are made to boundary scenarios. The rearrangement, which was largely devised by County staff rather than Stantec, nevertheless, has several positive features. Most notably, proposed Districts 4, 6, and 10 abutting the Town of Antigonish are more clearly suburban in character. Concentrating the suburban population in those districts has the further effect of reinforcing the rural character of Districts 1,2 , and 3 , which form the balance of the western part of the municipality.

Although variances are larger than with the previous Scenario 3 arrangement, with both proposed Districts 6 and 7 are $9.1 \%$ short of the average, all ten proposed districts are within $\pm 10 \%$ of the average number of electors for all districts. The revised scenario adheres to the voter parity criterion and should raise no issues for the NSUARB. The communities of St. Andrews, Lower South River, and West River were all divided to
create the revised scenario. Careful consideration was given to making divisions within the communities to ensure comprehensible boundaries.

## 5 Recommendation

We are submitting Scenario 1 as previously presented and a revised Scenario 3 labelled, respectively, as Options $A$ and $B$ in Appendix 1. Both scenarios provide for ten electoral districts meeting the $\pm 10 \%$ parity criterion emphasized by the NSUARB. Proposed electoral districts are generally constructed of NSCAF communities although several communities were divided to create the boundaries now proposed for Option B. The latter scenario can no longer be described as involving minimum changes to the Municipality's current boundary framework. It reflects, instead, adjustments to current districts aligned with Council and staff perceptions of related communities within the county.

It is our recommendation that:
Municipal Council approve taking Options A and B as presented in Appendix 1 forward to the second phase of public consultation for the Electoral Boundary Review process.

The scenarios are not final. They will be presented to the public as a choice but with the opportunity to comment on their features and suggest changes. With the approval of Council, Stantec will post a second online survey that will present the options and ask respondents to indicate their preference. Additional questions will provide the opportunity for survey respondents to raise issues that they perceive with boundaries, first dealing with the district in which they reside and then with other districts. Respondents will also be encouraged to offer alternatives.

We will also be conducting three public meetings across the county area at which we will present the scenarios and solicit similar input. Stantec will take this consultation into account in considering potential revisions to the boundaries before returning to Council for a decision. Satisfaction of the voter parity criterion will be a leading consideration at all points; however, absolute adherence is not essential so long as any substantial variation from the standard can be explained and justified to the NSUARB.

## APPENDIX 1 - PROPOSED BOUNDARY OPTIONS FOR PHASE 2 PUBLIC CONSULTATION

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## Background and Purpose

- The concept of a marketing levy in this area is not new.
- Provincial legislation was introduced in October of 2022 to allow
 municipalities to charge a tourism marketing levy of up to $3 \%$ on room rates of licensed fixed roof accommodations.
- This legislation aligns NS with other provinces in supporting tourism and offering new and vital source of revenue to be reinvested into the region.
- Some municipalities across the province have been charging a marketing levy for many years through their own special legislation (HRM, CBRM, Yarmouth).
- This is a powerful new tool to invest in our community.

## Background and Purpose

Section 75A(9) of the Nova Scotia Municipal Government Act,
 S.N.S. 1998, c. 18, gives Council the specific authority to establish a by-law to impose a marketing levy upon persons who, for a daily charge, fee or remuneration purchase Accommodation within the County. The purpose of this By-law is to provide for such a levy.

## Background and Purpose

- As part of our recently completed Tourism Strategy, some of the recommendations were:
- Develop a financial sustainability plan - including revenue sources and income generators.
- Establish a 3\% marketing levy through Town and County municipal by-laws.
- Create a governance structure reflecting leadership from the municipalities, tourism operators and partners.
- Develop a 3-5 business plan leveraging the marketing levy as a foundational revenue generator.

## Exemption from the Levy

- A person who pays for accommodation that is less than $\$ 20$
- Students living in a building owned by a post-secondary educational

- A person, and that person's family, staying while that person is receiving medical treatment at a hospital or provincial health-care centre or seeking specialist medical advice

## Registration of the Operator $\&$ Remittance

- Every operator must apply for and obtain a registration certificate under this By-law.
- All operators shall remit the levy as prescribed by the Municipality.


## Refunds and Offences

- On a first conviction: a fine of not less than $\$ 500$ and not more than $\$ 1,000$
- For a subsequent conviction: a fine of not less than $\$ 1,500$ and not more than \$5,000.

## Effective Date and Transition

- This by-law will take effect April 1, 2024

## RE: Tourism Marketing Levy By-Law

## Dear tourism operators:

The Municipality of the County of Antigonish, along with the Town of Antigonish, StFX University, DEANS, Antigonish Chamber of Commerce and Paqtnkek Mi'kmaw Nation have recently completed a Tourism Strategy for our community. This strategy, available on the County's website, was developed to increase tourism activity and visitor yields while supporting tourism operators in growing their capacity.

Through in person and virtual consultation along with a community survey the Tourism Strategy was developed with five strategic directions. The strategy aims to lead and grow with purpose, foster collaboration and partnership, positively impact all communities, market the Antigonish brand, and purposely grow the festival and event sector.

The first strategic direction recommended was to lead and grow with purpose by developing revenue sources and income generators by establishing a 3\% marketing levy through Town and County Municipal By-Laws.

Provincial legislation was introduced in October of 2022 to allow municipalities to charge a tourism marketing levy of up to $3 \%$ on room rates of licensed fixed roof accommodations. This legislation aligns NS with other provinces in supporting tourism and offering new and vital source of revenue to be reinvested into the community.

You are receiving this letter because you are registered as a licensed fixed roof accommodation provider with Tourism Nova Scotia. We would like to inform you that Antigonish County Council will be considering a Tourism Marketing Levy By-Law this winter with an effective date of April 1, 2024 if approved. The proposed By-Law is enclosed with this letter. The proposed By-Law would see a $3 \%$ marketing levy placed on overnight fixed roof accommodations.

Fixed roof accommodation providers (including Air BnB, VRBO, Cottages in Canada) would submit the enclosed registration form and be provided with a certificate from the Municipality. Providers would collect the $3 \%$ levy on the cost of overnight accommodations and remit the levy to the Municipality quarterly using the remittance form enclosed.

The funds collected through the levy will support tourism related activities and events attraction.

## Marketing Levy By-Law

### 1.0 Title

This By-law shall be titled and referred to as the "Marketing Levy By-Law".

### 2.0 Definitions

Accommodation - means supplying lodging in hotels and motels in any other facilities required to be licensed under the Tourist Accommodations Act and in a building owned or operated by a postsecondary educational institution where the hotel, motel, facility or building consists of one more rental units that are offered as lodging;

Council - means the Council of the Municipality of the County of Antigonish
Operation - means a person whose business sells, offers to sell, provides, and offers to provide accommodation in the County of Antigonish

County - means the Municipality of the County of Antigonish
Purchase price - means the price for which the accommodation is purchased, including the value of the services rendered and other consideration accepted by the operator in return for the accommodation provided, but does not include the goods and services tax.

### 3.0 Application of Levy

3.1 A marketing and promotions levy is hereby imposed on the County, the rate of which shall be three percent (3\%) of the purchase price of the accommodation.
3.2 The levy imposed under this By-law, must be collected at the time of the sale on the total amount of the purchase price and must be remitted to the County at the prescribed times and in the prescribed manner.
3.3 If a person collects an amount as if it were a levy imposed under this By-law, the person must remit the amount collected to the County at the same time and in the same manner as the levy collected under this By-law.

### 4.0 Exemption from Levy

4.1 The Marketing Levy shall not apply to:
a) A student who is housed in a building owned or operated by a post-secondary educational institution while the student is registered at and attending a post-secondary institution.
b) A person who is staying in a room for more than twenty-eight (28) consecutive days; or
c) A person, and the person's family, while receiving medical treatment at a hospital or provincial health-care centre or seeking specialist medical advice, provided the person provides a statement from said hospital or provincial health-care centre.

### 5.0 Registration of Operator

5.1 Every operator of a facility providing accommodations to which this By-law applies shall apply for and be issued a registration certificate by the County
a) Where an operator carries on business at more than one place, the operator shall obtain a registration certificate in each individual place of business.
5.2 The registration certificate shall be displayed in a prominent place on the premises.
5.3 Where an operator changes their address, they will return their registration certificate to the municipality for the amendment.
5.4 Where an operator changes the name of nature of their business, the operator will return their registration certificate to the municipality for a new one.
5.5 Where an operator ceases to carry on business that a registration certificate has been issued, the certificate shall be void, and the operator shall return the certificate to the County within 15 days of the date of closure.
5.6 Where a registration certificate is lost or destroyed, a request shall be made to the County for a copy of the original.
5.7 A registration certificate granted under subsection (1) is not transferable.

### 6.0 Return and Remittance of Levy

6.1 The County may at any time require a return of sales and levy collected by any person selling accommodation; such return to cover any period or periods.
6.2 Subject to the provisions of subsection (6.1), unless otherwise provided, all operators shall make separate quarterly returns to the municipality.
6.3 A separate return shall be made for each place of business unless a consolidated return has been approved by the County.
6.4 The returns by operators shall be made and the levy shall be remitted to the County the $15^{\text {th }}$ day of January, April, July and October.
6.5 If an operator during the preceding period has collected no levy, the operator shall make a report to that effect on the prescribed return form.
6.6 Where an operator ceases to carry on or disposes of his business, the operator shall make the return to that effect on the prescribed return form.

### 7.0 Records

7.1 Every operator shall keep books of accounts, records, and documents sufficient to furnish the municipality with the necessary particulars of
a) sales of accommodation,
b) amount of levy collected, and
c) disposal of levy.
7.2 All entries concerning the levy in such books of account, records and documents shall be separate and distinguishable from other entries made therein.
7.3 Where a receipt, bill, invoice, or other document is issued by a person selling accommodation, the levy shall be shown as a separate item thereon.

### 8.0 Calculation of Levy

8.1 Where an operator sells an accommodation in combination with meals and other specialized services for an all-inclusive package price, the purchase price of the accommodation shall be deemed to be the price that will be collected for the levy.

### 9.0 Refund of Levy Collected in Error

9.1 If the County is satisfied that a levy or a portion of a levy has been paid in error, the County shall refund the amount of the overpayment to the person entitled.
9.2 If the County is satisfied that an operator has remitted to the County an amount as collected levy that the operator neither collected nor was required to collect under this By-law, the County must refund the amount to the operator.

### 10.0 Claim for Refund

10.1 To claim a refund under this By-law, a person must
a) submit to the County an application in writing signed by the person who paid the amount claimed, and
b) provide sufficient evidence to satisfy the County that the person who paid the amount is entitled to the refund.
10.2 For the purposes of subsection (1) (a), if the person who paid the amount claimed is a corporation, the application must be signed by a director or authorized employee of the corporation.

### 11.0 Offence

11.1 A person who contravenes a provision of the By-law is guilty of an offence punishable by summary conviction and on conviction is liable.
a) on a first conviction, to a fine of not less than $\$ 500$ and not more than $\$ 1,000$ and
b) for a subsequent conviction for the same or another provision of this regulation, to a fine of not less than $\$ 1,500$ and not more than $\$ 5,000$.

### 12.0 Administration of By-Law

12.1 This By-law shall be administered on behalf of the County by the Chief Administrator Officer and any persons designated by the Chief Administrator Officer.

### 13.0 Effective Date

13.1 This By-law shall take effect from first day of April, 2024.

# BYLAWS <br> FOR <br> R.K. MACDONALD NURSING HOME CORPORATION 

Revised September 28, 2023


Adopted April 19, 1971
(Revised May 25, 1978, May 25, 1984, 1992, January 25, 2001, May 26, 2022, March, 2023, September, 2023)

## ARTICLE I <br> INTERPRETATION

In these By-laws, the following words shall have the following meanings:
a) "Board" shall mean the Board of Directors of the R.K. MacDonald Nursing Home Corporation.
b) "CEO" shall mean chief executive officer of the Nursing Home.
c) "Corporation" shall mean the R.K. MacDonald Nursing Home Corporation.
d) "County Council" shall mean the Council of the Municipality of the County of Antigonish. or it's successors
e) "Director" shall mean a person duly appointed as a Director of the R.K. MacDonald Nursing Home Corporation.
f) "Ex Officio" shall mean a person who has their position on the Board because of the office that person holds and shall be a member without a vote, of all committees of the Board.
g) "Nursing Home" shall mean the R.K. MacDonald Nursing Home Corporation offering care under the Homes for Special Care Act, RSNS 1989, C. 203.
h) "Operating Agreement" shall mean the Agreement, dated June 1, 1971, between the Corporation, and the Sisters of St. Martha regarding the R.K. MacDonald Nursing Home and all amendments or extensions thereto or any subsequent Agreement replacing the same.
i) "Resident" shall mean all persons cared for in the Nursing Home.
j) "Sisters" shall mean the Sisters of Saint Martha.
k) "Sisters of Saint Martha" shall mean Sisters of Saint Martha, a body corporate.

1) "Special Resolution" means a resolution passed by not less than three fourths (3/4) of such persons entitled to vote as are present at a meeting of which notice specifying the intention to propose the resolution as a special resolution has been duly given.
m) "Town Council" shall mean the Council of the Town of Antigonish. Or it's successors.

## ARTICLE II BOARD OF DIRECTORS

## Section 1 Board

The Corporation and the facilities of the Corporation shall be under the management of the Board of Directors. The Board shall have the powers and duties set out in the Municipal Housing Corporations Act, R.S.N.S. 1989, C. 304. See Appendix A.

## Section 2 Board Composition

The Board shall consist of 9 to 12 Directors, 3 to 4 persons appointed by the Town of Antigonish, 3 to 4 persons appointed by the Municipality of the County of Antigonish, and 3 to 4 persons appointed by the Congregation of the Sisters of St. Martha, provided however that no employee of the Corporation shall be a director.

## Section 3 Term

Directors shall hold office for four years or until a successor is appointed. Every director may be eligible for re-appointment for two consecutive terms. Following such two consecutive terms, unless otherwise agreed to by the Board, such member must take at least a one-year absence before being eligible for re-appointment.

## Section 4 Ceasing to Hold Office

A director ceases to hold office upon the earliest:
a) the director dies or becomes mentally incompetent;

b) the director's successor is appointed;
c) the director resigns by providing written notice of such resignation to the Board;
d) the Board, by special resolution, removes any director before the expiration of that director's term; or
e) a Director is absent from three consecutive Board or Committee meetings without a valid reason(s) as determined by the Board.

Where any vacancy occurs in the Board, the Board shall fill the vacancy.

## Section 5 Operating Policies

The Board may adopt or amend such operating policies that are not inconsistent with the By-laws relating to such matters as terms of reference of committees, duties of officers, Board code of conduct, as well as procedural and other requirements relating to the By-laws as the Board may deem appropriate from time to time.

## ARTICLE III <br> OFFICERS

## Section 1 Positions

The Officers of the Board shall be: Chair, Vice-Chair, Secretary, and Treasurer, and such other officer positions as may be determined by the Board. The officer positions shall be elected by the Board annually at the annual meeting of the Board and shall hold office for a term of one year or until their successors have been elected. Each officer must be a director of the Corporation.

## Section 2 Chair

The Chair shall preside at all meetings of the Board. The Chair shall act as Chair of the Executive Committee and shall be an ex-officio member, with a vote of all committees in which they are in attendance and in general shall exercise the powers and perform the duties common to the office of Chair.

## Section $3 \quad$ Vice-Chair

In the absence of the Chair, the Vice-Chair shall act as Chair and shall exercise the powers and perform the duties of the Chair. In the absence of both Chair and Vice-Chair, the Board shall appoint a Chair pro tempore.

## Section $4 \quad$ Secretary

The Secretary shall keep an accurate record of all business transacted at all meetings of Board and of the Executive Committee. The Secretary shall write and attend to all correspondence of the

Board and shall perform such other duties as usually pertain to this office or as may be assigned by the Board. The Secretary's duties shall be performed by such officers or employee as may be appointed by the Board, in certain circumstances.

## Section 5 Treasurer

The Treasurer shall be appointed by the Board and shall have all the powers and duties generally pertaining to the office including the responsibility for:
a) Reports of all financial holdings and transaction of the Board,
b) Annual Financial Reports to the Board and the Corporation of the financial operations of Nursing Home and such other financial reports as are required from time to time by the Board, the Corporation or by law.

## Section 6 Conflict of Interest

A Director has an indirect pecuniary interest in any matter:
a) if the Director
i. is a shareholder in, or a director or senior officer of, a corporation that does not offer its shares to the public,
ii. has a substantial interest in, or is a director or senior officer of, a corporation that offers its shares to the public, or
iii. is a member of a body, whether incorporated or not, that has an interest in any matter in which the Board has a financial relationship; or
b) if the Director is a partner of or associated in a joint venture with a person, or is in the employ of a person or body, whether incorporated or not, that has an interest in any matter in which the Board has a financial relationship.
c) The provisions of Section 6, Conflict of Interest, also apply to any individual serving as a regular member of any committee, even if not a member of the RK Board, including advisors.

The pecuniary interest of:
a) the spouse of a Director;
b) any son, daughter, father, mother, brother or sister of a Director or the Director's spouse;
c) the spouse of the persons referred to in clause (b); and
d) any other person who normally resides in the same home as the Director,
e) business relationship noted here is as defined in the Municipal Conflict of Interest Act.
shall, if known to the member or of which the Director reasonably should have known, be deemed to be also a pecuniary interest of the Director.

Where a Director, either on their own behalf or while acting for, by, with or through another, has any direct or indirect pecuniary interest, in any matter and is present at a meeting of the Board at which the matter is the subject of consideration, they shall:
a) As soon as practicable after the commencement of the meeting disclose their interest and the general nature thereof;
b) Withdraw from the meeting whenever discussion of the matter by the Board occurs;
c) Refrain from taking any part in the consideration or discussion of the matter and from voting on any question relating to the matter; and
d) Refrain from attempting in any way, whether before, during or after the meeting, to influence the decision of other members of the Board with respect to the matter.

Where the Director was not present at a meeting at which a matter in which, he/she, either on his/her own behalf or while acting for, by, with or through another, has any direct or indirect pecuniary interest was the subject of consideration, he/she shall disclose his/her interest at the next meeting he/she attends and the provisions above shall apply to him/her in respect of the matter.

A Director shall comply with this section in respect of any matter in which he/she intends to obtain a pecuniary interest, either on his/her own behalf or while acting for, by, with or through another.

Every declaration of interest and the general nature thereof disclosed pursuant to Section 6 shall be recorded in the minutes of the meeting.

## Indemnity

Every director and officer of the Corporation and his or her heirs, executors and administrators, and estate and effects, respectively, shall from time to time and at all times, be indemnified and saved harmless out of the funds of the Corporation, from and against:
a) All costs, charges and expenses which such director or officer sustains or incurs in or about any action, suit or proceedings which is brought, commenced or prosecuted against him or her, or in respect of any act, deed, error, omission, matter, or thing whatsoever, made, done, not done, or permitted by him or her, in or about the execution of the duties of his or her office or in respect of any such liability, except such costs, charges or expenses as are occasioned by his or her own gross negligence; and
b) All other costs, charges and expenses which he or she sustains or incurs in or about or in relation to the affairs thereof, except such costs, charges or expenses as are occasioned by his or her own willful neglect or default.

## ARTICLE IV <br> COMMITTEES

## Section 1 Committees

All Committees of the Board shall be appointed by the Board. Committees shall be Standing and Special. Each Committee shall have representation from the CEO (ex-officio) and each of the appointees of the Town of Antigonish, Municipality of the County of Antigonish, and the Congregation of the Sisters of St. Martha, unless otherwise agreed upon by the respective organization.

## Section 2 Standing Committees

Standing Committees are appointed by the Board and are as follows: Executive Committee; Finance Committee; Quality, Safety and Governance Committee; and the Building and Grounds Committee.

The Board may appoint further Standing Committees on an ad hoc basis, as required.

## Section 3 Executive Committee

The Executive Committee shall consist of the Chair, Vice-Chair, Secretary, Treasurer, CEO (exofficio) and one director elected by the Board at its Annual Meeting, or Regular Meeting of the Board ensuring at all times that at least one member of the Executive Committee shall be a member of the Board appointed by a member of the Town of Antigonish, a member of the Municipality of the County of Antigonish and a member of the Congregation of the Sisters of St. Martha.

The Executive Committee shall have power to transact all regular business of the Nursing Home during the interim between meetings of the Board, provided that any action taken by this Committee shall not conflict with the policies of the Board, the By-laws, and the Operating Agreement.

## Section 4 Finance Committee

The Finance Committee shall consist of the Treasurer, CEO (ex-officio), Director of Finance (exofficio), and four members appointed by the Board. It shall deal with all matters of a financial nature referred to it by the Board.

The Chief Administrative Officer of the Municipality of the County of Antigonish and the Chief Administrative Officer of the Town of Antigonish (or their respective designate), (the CAO's) shall be entitled to attend meetings of the Finance Committee. For clarity, the role of the CAO's (or designates) shall be to offer advice and information on behalf of the Town of Antigonish and
the Municipality of the County of Antigonish as requested by the Board. They shall have no right to participate in Finance Committee decision-making, i.e. no voting privileges.

## Section 5 Buildings and Grounds Committee

The Building and Grounds Committee shall consist of the CEO (ex-officio), Director of Environmental Services (ex-officio), and at least three members, or individuals from the community, appointed by the Board. It shall have general supervision of the maintenance of the property of the Nursing Home.

## Section 6 Quality, Safety \& Governance Committee

The Quality, Safety and Governance Committee is responsible for providing oversight for the Board with the objective of ensuring accountability, good governance and transparency.

The Committee consists of four members appointed by the Board with a minimum of one representative member from the Town of Antigonish, one representative member from the Municipality of the County of Antigonish, and one representative member from the Congregation of the Sisters of St. Martha; along with the CEO (ex-officio), Director of Clinical Services (exofficio). Unless otherwise agreed upon by their respective organizations.

## Section 7 Election of Officers and Standing Committees

At the regular meeting of the Board on or before two months before the AGM, a Nominating Committee consisting of three members, shall be appointed to bring to the annual meeting a slate of officers for the coming year.

## Section 8 Special Committees

Special Committees may be appointed by the Board from time to time. Such Special Committees shall be advisory and shall limit their activities to the specific task for which they were appointed, upon completion these Special Committees shall be discharged.

## Section 9 Committee Members

All Committees, except the Executive Committee, shall elect a Chair and a Secretary from among its members. A quorum of any committee shall consist of a minimum of two-thirds of the voting members of the Committee.

## Section 10 Reports

All Committees shall submit a report to the next Regular Meeting of the Board. As necessary, the Board Chair issues a report highlighting any issues of importance to the leadership of the Town of Antigonish, Municipality of the County of Antigonish and the Congregation of the Sisters of St. Martha's.

## Section 11 Medical Advisor

A Medical Advisor shall be appointed by the Board and the said advisor shall be a duly qualified medical practitioner. The duties of the medical advisor shall include the following:
a) Report in writing to the CEO of the home any instance in which, in the opinion of the Medical Advisor, the medical care being provided to a resident is inadequate;
b) Compile and make available such information as the Board may require with respect to the residents;
c) Advise the CEO of the nursing home, on all pertinent matters relating to the physical and mental health of the residents in the nursing home.

## ARTICLE V <br> MEETINGS

## Section 1 Types of Meetings

Meetings of the Board shall be regular, special and committee meetings. The Annual meeting of the board shall be held no later than the end of June each year. Regular meetings shall be held monthly, at the discretion of the Chair in consultation with the Executive Committee.

## Section 4 Special Meetings

Special meetings of the Board may be called by the Chair or shall be called by the Chair at the request of one-third of the directors.

## Section 5 Notice of Meetings

Notice of any general or special meeting, other than the annual general meeting, shall be given to each director at least three days before the date of such meeting and the time, place, and purpose of the meeting shall be specified in the notice. Notice of the annual general meeting shall be given to each director at least seven days before the date of such meeting and the time, place and purpose of the meeting shall be specified in the notice. Notice of any meeting shall be given to directors by ordinary mail, email, telephone, fax and/or other electronic means.

If an emergency meeting is deemed necessary, twenty-four hours shall be deemed sufficient notice for such emergency special meeting, unless such shorter notice period is unanimously agreed to by the Board.

At a general or special meeting, no business shall be transacted other than that for which notice was given, unless a minimum two - thirds of the directors are present and by unanimous consent of those present, it is agreed to deal with matters concerning which no notice was given.

The non-receipt of notice by any director shall not invalidate any proceedings. Notice can be waived for all meetings with the unanimous approval of those present at the meeting.

A resolution in writing signed by all directors is as valid as if it had been passed at a meeting of the Board. A copy of every resolution of the Board shall be kept with the minutes of meetings of the Board.

## Section $6 \quad$ Quorum

A quorum at any regular or special meeting shall be a minimum of two-thirds of the total membership of the Board. No meeting shall be held, and no motions made, unless a quorum is present.

## Section $7 \quad$ Roberts Rules of Order

The rules contained in the current edition of Robert's Rules of Order shall govern the Corporation in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with these Bylaws and/or any other special rules of order that the Corporation may adopt.

Section $8 \quad$ Votes
Each director present at a meeting shall vote on all questions put; where there is an equality of votes, the motion shall be deemed lost.

## Section 9 Electronic Meetings

If the Corporation chooses to make available a telephonic, electronic, or other communication facility that permits all participants to communicate adequately with each other during a meeting, any person entitled to attend such meeting may participate in the meeting by any such telephonic, electronic or other communication facility. A person participating in a meeting by such means is deemed to be present at the meeting. Any person participating in a meeting pursuant to this section who is entitled to vote at that meeting may vote, by means of any telephonic, electronic, videoconference, or other communication facility that the Board has made available for that purpose.

## ARTICLE VI CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER

## Section 1 Appointment

The Chief Executive Officer (CEO) shall be appointed by the Board in accordance with the Operating Agreement referred to herein.

## Section 2 Responsibilities

a) The CEO is responsible for the overall operational and financial management of the facilities and the duties of the CEO shall include the following:

1. Responsibility for the management of the Nursing Home at all times;
2. Responsibility for the application and implementation of established policies;
3. Responsibility for the implementation of approved standards for the quality of care;
4. The maintenance of effective liaison between the Board and the Nursing Home staff, including medical staff, and outside agencies involved in the Nursing Home's activities;
5. Attendance or representation at meetings of the Board providing to the Board any reports respecting relevant material, information, and program changes;
6. Attendance at meetings of Board Committees, staff management, planning, and appropriate medical meetings;
7. Recommendations to the Board on the appointment of a Medial Advisor, advice to the Board as to changes in key personnel and on policies, and changes in policy that seem conducive to good management practices;
8. Maintenance of good community relationships with other organizations.
(b) Any responsibilities of the CEO under these By-laws, shall, in the absence of the CEO, be carried out by the person designated by the CEO or, where the CEO has not designated a person to act, by the person designated by the Board to act for the CEO in the absence of the CEO.

## Section 3 Ex-officio member

The CEO shall be an ex-officio member without a vote, of all committees of the Board.

## ARTICLE VII <br> AUDITORS

## Section 1 Fiscal Year

The fiscal year shall begin on the first of April and end on the thirty-first day of March.

## Section 2 Audits

The accounts of the Nursing Home shall be audited annually by a registered municipal auditor appointed annually by the Board and licensed under the Public Accountants Act, R.S.N.S. 1989, C. 369

## ARTICLE VIII <br> CORPORATE SEAL

## Section 1

The Corporation shall have a Corporate Seal which shall be adopted and shall be used as designated by the Board. The Secretary shall have corporate custody of the Seal.

## ARTICLE IX <br> MISCELLANEOUS

Notwithstanding the provisions hereof, in the event of any conflict or inconsistency that may exist between these by-laws or amendments thereto, and the provisions of the Homes for Special Care Act. R.S.N.S. 1989, C. 203, the Act shall supersede.

## Section 1 Amendments

a) These By-laws may be amended at any regular or special meeting of the Board, provided two weeks' notice of such proposed amendments shall be given to all directors and the same is approved by two-thirds majority of those present and voting;
b) Such amendments shall not be effective until approved by the Town of Antigonish, Municipality of the County of Antigonish, the Congregation of the Sisters of St. Martha. , the Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing, and the Minister of Seniors and LongTerm Care of the Province of Nova Scotia or its successors.

## Section 2 Repeal

All previous By-laws are repealed upon the coming into effect of the By-laws herein.

## Section 3 Coming into Force

The By-laws herein shall come into force and effect upon being approved by the Town of Antigonish, Municipality of the County of Antigonish, the Congregation of the Sisters of St. Martha, the Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housings, and the Minister of Seniors and LongTerm Care of the Province of Nova Scotia or its successors.

# SUBJECT: F23/24 STREETLIGHT LEVY MACPHERSON ST., DUYKERS DRIVE AND HARGREAVES WAY \& REIMBURSEMENT OF NSPI INVOICES 

DATE: DECEMBER 12, 2023

The Municipality of the County of Antigonish took possession of the streetlights on MacPherson St., Duykers Drive and Hargreaves Way in 2021 from Nova Capital Incorporated. In the transition of physical ownership of the streetlights, the name change on the NSPI account was missed and as a result Nova Capital Incorporated has requested a reimbursement for all NSPI invoices paid since the County took over the streetlights. As of November 23, 2023, the NSPI account is under the Municipality of the County of Antigonish name so any invoices after that date will be sent directly to the Municipality of the County of Antigonish.

The total invoices paid by Nova Capital Incorporated is $\$ \mathbf{3 , 0 6 3 . 5 0}$ which they are requesting to be reimbursed to S.F. Smith Retirement Living.

Our streetlighting procedure is that the properties that receive benefit of the streetlights pay an annual levy on their annual property tax invoice. The streetlight levy is calculated based on the operating costs of the streetlights whether the streetlights are maintained by NSPI or Town Electric Utility. The streetlight levy is revenue neutral budget line item for the County.

There are 38 properties that benefit from these streetlights (all of the 38 properties are owned by S.F. Smith Retirement Living). Inline with our streetlight levy, these 38 properties would receive an adjustment on their billing in the amount of $\$ 93.95$ for the Fiscal 2023/24 taxation year. This amount would be annualized for the Fiscal 2024/25 taxation billing and would be substantially reduced on a go forward basis as the proposed levy for this fiscal year includes invoices dated back to 2021.

## Staff Recommendation:

- Reimburse S.F. Smith Retirement Living Incorporated \$3,063.50 for NSPI invoices on streetlights that they paid dated back to 2021.
- Include a $\$ 93.95$ streetlight levy for Fiscal Year 2023/24 on 38 properties where these streetlights are installed. This would be inline with our streetlight levy procedures.
