Call to Order- Warden MacInnis

Warden MacInnis called the meeting to order at 7:35pm.

Approval of Agenda

Warden MacInnis called for approval of the Council meeting agenda.

Consideration of the February 10, 2026 Municipal Council Minutes

Warden MacInnis called for any errors or omissions in the minutes of February 10, 2026. Hearing none, the minutes were considered accepted as presented.

Business Arising from the Minutes

There was no business arising from the minutes.

Delegations

Renewable Energy Systems (RES) Group

Mr. Martin provided Council with an update on the Eigg Mountain renewable energy project that the RES Group is undertaking. He reviewed the details expected for the development, estimated to include 22 turbines with a total installed capacity of 154 MW with a transmission line and switching station connected to Addington Forks.

Mr. Martin reviewed what is new, and what is expected, as part of their project. He noted that the Environmental Assessment is underway, and a decision is expected in early April. He spoke to community engagement measures that are underway and noted that the geotechnical investigation and land survey is happening. Permits for zoning have been submitted to the Eastern District Planning Commission, and more community engagement is planned.

The floor was then opened for questions from Council. Questions were asked about the anticipated carbon return on the project, shadow flicker, noise impacts, and impacts on wildlife with particular interest in the mainland moose. Further details about the path of the proposed transmission line over Brown's Mountain was also requested. A suggestion was made to have RES share more information about the project with the community, through a mailout, to provide more insight into the scope of the project. The concerns raised by the local snowmobiling community regarding their use of utility roads in the area was raised.

The representatives from RES were thanked for their presentation.

Correspondence

Mrs. Donovan spoke to the letter included in the agenda package from Eric Stackhouse regarding library funding concerns following the Province's proposed budget. The letter was put forward for Council's information.
